Did you know...

... in 1832, Harvard University professor Charles Follen, may have been the first American to illuminate a Christmas tree when he decorated his with candles. As you can imagine it presented a few issues, namely having a very large, very flammable tree in your living room! So it was a great relief to many when on December 22, 1882, Edward Johnson displayed the first electrically illuminated Christmas tree in the parlour of his New York City home.

Today we are spoilt for choice when it comes purchasing fairy lights, available in various colours, sizes and a variety of flashing and sparkling patterns to choose from.

Our recommendation will always be to go the LED route – they are always cool to the touch, some manufacturers claim they save 90% electricity over normal bulbs and can last up to 100,000 hours or 10 years.
